



WHY DOES THE TOWNSHIP SWEEP THE STREETS - Street sweeping is necessary for a number of reasons. It helps keep vehicles and pedestrian safe by keeping debris off the roadways, it helps keep streets well maintained and it helps protect surface water quality and the environment.

WHEN DOES THE STREET SWEEPING OCCUR - The Township conducts bi-annual street sweeping in the Spring (April / May) and the Fall (October until the 1st snow fall). Spring Street Sweeping removes the de-icing materials and debris that piles up on the streets over the winter and helps protect water quality by keeping sediment-filled runoff from entering our storm drains, ponds streams and lakes. Fall Street Sweeping helps prevent the fallen leaves and other materials from entering our storm drains, ponds, streams and lakes.



ESCAPING THE WEATHER THIS WINTER? Residents who leave the Township for extended periods of time, generally during the winter months, need to notify Utility Billing (651-747-2754) when they leave to provide a forwarding address. Utility bills are not forwarded via the U.S. Postal Service, and are returned to the Township as “temporarily away”. These bills are then subject to late fees if the property owner does not realize they were not forwarded. Residents should also notify the Township when they return, so their normal mailing address can be used.



WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS BEGINNING NOVEMBER 1ST – No vehicle may park on any road or street in the Township between the hours of 2 a.m. & 6 a.m., from November 1st through April 1st, or any time after a snowfall of one or more inches, until the road is cleared curb to curb.
