REMEMBER, WHAT WE DO ON LAND AFFECTS THE QUALITY OF WATER WE DRINK – HERE ARE A FEW TIPS TO REMEMBER

- **Oil, antifreeze & batteries can be recycled.** Clean up any spills immediately, kitty litter or sawdust will absorb the spill. Be sure to sweep these up as well.
- Wash your car on the grass so that the **water, detergent & dirt** will be filtered by the soil.
- Empty bottles of **household cleaners, pesticides & weed killer** should be disposed of according to label directions.
- **Grass clippings** in the street should be swept up after each mowing. Grass clippings left in the street are being washed down into the storm sewers & end up in waterways where they have the potential to cause algae blooms.
- **Paints, paint thinners & solvents** can be taken to the Ramsey County Household Hazardous Waste site, call 651-633-EASY (3279) for more information. Paint brushes used with water based paint can be rinsed in the sink.
- When walking your pet use a bag or use a scooper to clean up your **pet’s waste**. In order to keep animal waste from contaminating our community, anyone who walks a pet should properly dispose of waste by picking it up. Wrapping it & either placing it into the trash or flushing it unwrapped.
