



THE RAMSEY COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PROVIDES MANY SERVICES FOR YOUTHS IN THE TOWNSHIP INCLUDING:

- **Fingerprinting** – Youth under the age of 18 can be fingerprinted on a card at no cost. This card is not for official use but is kept by parents or guardians in case of future need. For information regarding Kid Print call 651-266-7332.
- **Youth Safety Classes** – The Ramsey County Sheriff's Office, under the direction of the Minnesota DNR, provides youth safety classes for snowmobile safety, firearms safety and ATV safety throughout the year. Class dates & times throughout the State are listed on the DNR website at <http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/es/index.html> approximately two months prior to the class. Class sizes are limited, offered on a first come, first serve basis, and subject to change. Upon completion of a specific class a safety certificates are issued.
- **Law Enforcement Career Exploring Program** – This program is designed for youth (male or female), ages 14 through 20 who have an interest in learning more about careers in public safety. The program goal is to encourage youth to become responsible citizens of the community. The Explorer Program provides youth with education, training, & first-hand career experience as well as leadership & community service opportunities. Upon entrance into the program, new explorers are required to attend an Explorer's Academy. Fifteen students on average attend the Explorer Academy each year.
