The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

Present: Anderson, Brueckner, LeBlanc, Lee, Linn, Griffin, Pozzini-Stedman; Town Board Liaison: Prudhon; Staff Liaison: Short.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA (Additions/Deletions): LeBlanc moved approval of the agenda as submitted. Brueckner seconded. Ayes all.

APPROVAL OF MAY 3, 2018 MINUTES (Additions/Deletions): LeBlanc moved approval of the May 3, 2018 Minutes. Griffin seconded. Ayes all.

CONSENT AGENDA: LeBlanc moved approval of the Consent Agenda as follows: 4A) Receive Animal Control Reports; 4B) Receive Ramsey County Sheriff's Reports; 4C) Receive Sheriff's Contract Group Minutes; 4D) Receive White Bear Lake Fire Department Report. Griffin seconded. Ayes all.

COMMISSIONER'S REPORT – TOWN BOARD ACTION: **Speed Limit – Bald Eagle Avenue:** There are concerns about speeding. Neighbors would like the speed limit to drop to 25 mph from Otter Lake Road to Bald Eagle Avenue to improve safety. **Stillwater Street:** Ramsey County will resurface Stillwater Street this year. However, no drainage work is proposed at this time. **Lake Links Trail – Around White Bear Lake:** The legislature has approved bonding funds in the amount of \$4 million for the project. \$2.6 million is for South Shore Boulevard. **Rutherford Park:** Saputo is considering awarding a \$11,000.00 grant for a trail head shelter for bikes at the park. **Night to Unite:** It was the consensus that anything that flashes would be a good give-away for the kids. Anything that can be put on pack packs or anything that makes noise is also popular. It would be a good idea to have public safety pamphlets.

TOWNSHIP DAY PARTICIPATION – BIKE GIVE-AWAY: It was the consensus that bike safety equipment should be emphasized. It was the consensus that word needs to get out when the bike is auctioned that it is provided by the Public Safety Commission. Photos of the bike should also be displayed at the PSC table. Lisa Beecroft, Township Day Coordinator is having promotional materials prepared for the event. The bike will be featured on some promotional material. The footprint of the event has changed for this year. The vendors will be in the upper parking lot and entertainment in the lower lot. The Public Safety Commission will be near the Park Board booth in the upper parking lot.

RENTAL HOUSING – CONTINUE DISCUSSION: Discussion continued from last month's meeting relative to rental housing in White Bear Township. Comments and suggestions included:

- Can we have an ordinance similar to the City of St. Paul where fines can be imposed on property owners who violate the ordinance?
- What tools does the Township have to impose an administrative fine? (The Clerk talked with the Town Attorney. The Town does have the authority to impose fines.)

- What is a reasonable charge?
- We need to have a due process for violators.
- How do we justify the actual fine?
- Can the proceeds from the fines be placed in the Public Safety Commission account, such as false alarm fines are?
- Need to figure out how much a squad/sheriff deputy costs so fines can be justified. (The Clerk will look into the fine schedule.)
- Issue a fine or a criminal citation?
- Have an enforcement section in the housing maintenance code.

It was the consensus that information on a fine scheduled be prepared. The matter will be brought back for more discussion when this information is available.

TOBACCO ORDINANCE – PROHIBITED SALES-AGE: It was the consensus to ask Katie Engman, after September, to provide a presentation at a future meeting on what is going on with tobacco regulations.

LIAISON REPORTS: Fire Department: The WBL Fire Department has gone to a “duty crew” model for coverage at the department. The duty crew stays at the fire department 24/7 during their shifts, rather than being called from home when coverage is needed. Starting on May 1st, EMTs and para-medics respond to all emergencies. Ramsey County dispatch is now providing dispatch services for the WBL Fire Department.

NEXT MEETING DATE / ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION: There will be no July meeting. The next PSC meeting will be Thursday, September 6, 2018. Items for discussion will include: 1) Feedback from Night to Unite; 2) Township Day (September 8th); 3) Rental Housing; 4) Feedback from Night to Unite.

Brueckner moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 p.m. LeBlanc seconded. Ayes all.





Night to Unite continues to be a popular method of building connections between the residents of the Contract Communities and the public safety agencies that serve them.

The Sheriff's Office coordinates the registration of Night to Unite events in the Contract Communities to facilitate the ability for deputies, fire departments, and city officials to plan visits to the events. Registrations were collected online, US Mail, and fax beginning on May 1, 2018. Promotional efforts to encourage registrations included city and county newsletters, website, billboards, email, news outlets, social media, and word of mouth.

This year 199 events were registered, up from 184 last year, representing 5,894 homes and 3,459 children. Eleven multi-family housing entities registered events.

Events by city:

Arden Hills – 26 Falcon Heights – 10 Little Canada – 20 North Oaks – 14
Shoreview – 84 Vadnais Heights – 22 White Bear Township – 22

New events or first-time hosts: 36 (37 in 2017, 28 in 2016)

The Event Host Appreciation Dinner, held at the Shoreview Community Center on Wednesday, August 1st, was attended by 172 hosts representing 93 events. Event materials were distributed at this event. Hosts unable to attend picked up their materials at the Patrol Station, or in the case of 39 hosts the materials were delivered when Deputies visited the event.

With the cooperation of staff from throughout the Sheriff's Office – Administration, Courts, Detention, Regional Services – we assembled 46 Ambassador Teams headed by a sworn deputy who matched up with Correctional Officers, Community Affairs Officers, Chaplains, Reserve Deputies, civilian staff, spouses of staff, Ramsey County Attorney staff, city councilmembers (Arden Hills, North Oaks), and others who went out in squad cars to visit the events.

The School Supply Drive participation was again near 60% with 115 of the 199 events collecting supplies. The supplies have been boxed for equal distribution to the 15 public schools located in the Contract Communities.

Funding for Night to Unite event materials and activities was provided from these sources: Contract Communities Budget \$5,000; Land of Lakes Foundation donation \$5,000; Target Corporation donation \$2,000; Boston Scientific donation \$2,000; Ramsey County Sheriff's Foundation donation \$2,500.

Materials provided to the events included sidewalk chalk and beach balls for the children, notepads with crime prevention and reporting suspicious activity tips, Sheriff's Office contact card, and auto theft information from the County Attorney's Office in a reusable reflective striped sport bag. Block Party yard signs were provided for new events and those who informed us they lost their signs from previous years. Event hosts were provided with a Neighborhood Watch information and registration packet.

The value of forming and maintaining an active Neighborhood Watch group, and the importance of calling 911 to reach public safety services were the main 2018 message themes.



What is 'suspicious' – when is the right time to call the police

Have you ever seen someone in your neighborhood, and thought, "That person doesn't belong here..."? Have you thought about calling the police to investigate? Were you unsure if it would be appropriate to call?

There have been a lot of recent conversations surrounding 'suspicious activity', the changing demographics of our communities, and what is the difference between appearance and behavior.


The Sheriff's Office, like all public safety agencies, cannot function without the assistance of responsible citizens. We need your help in reporting crimes, emergencies, and suspicious activity. Timely reporting leads to timely response. Deputies would rather find an innocent explanation, or prevent illegal activity, than be called to investigate a crime after it is committed. You are not bothering the police when you call; responding to your concerns and needs is why we are here.

Examples of when to call:

- ♦ A crime has occurred
- ♦ Someone is in imminent danger or needs help
- ♦ You have been in or witnessed an accident
- ♦ You see evidence of wrongdoing
- ♦ Alarms sounding or glass being broken
- ♦ Someone is loitering around cars, or peering into them
- ♦ Slow moving vehicles at night without lights driving aimlessly
- ♦ Abandoned vehicle parked on your street
- ♦ Someone seen with a weapon

When you call, you will be asked about the specific behavior that concerns you. Deputies typically respond to all calls, so, before traumatizing an innocent neighbor or guest, please carefully consider the reason for your suspicions. An Irving, California neighborhood group developed this flow chart to help their residents with the decision on when to call:

NINE APPS

PARENTS SHOULD KNOW ABOUT

BUMBLE
BUMBLE is similar to the popular dating app "Tinder" however, it requires women to make the first contact. Kids have been known to use BUMBLE to create fake accounts and falsify their age.

SNAPCHAT
SNAPCHAT is one of the most popular apps of 2018. While the app promises users can take a photo/video and it will disappear, recent features including "stories" allows users to view content for up to 24 hours. Snapchat also allows users to see your location.

KIK
KIK allows anyone to contact and direct message your child. Kids can bypass traditional text messaging features. KIK gives users unlimited access to anyone anywhere, anytime.

LIVEME
LIVE.ME is a live-streaming video app that uses geolocation to share videos so users can find out a broadcaster's exact location. Users can earn "coins" as a way to "pay" minors for photos.

HOLLA
HOLLA is a self-proclaimed "addicting" video chat app that allows users to meet people all over the world in just seconds. Reviewers say they have been confronted with racial slurs, explicit content, and more.

WHISPER
WHISPER is an anonymous social network that promotes sharing secrets with strangers. It also reveals a user's location so people can meet up.

ASK.FM
ASK.FM is known for cyber bullying. The app encourages users to allow anonymous people to ask them questions.

CALCULATOR%
CALCULATOR% is only one of SEVERAL secret apps used to hide photos, videos, files, and browser history.

HOT OR NOT
HOT OR NOT encourages users to rate your profile, check out people in their area, and chat with strangers. The goal of this app is to hook up.

Speed Enforcement: extra patrol efforts scheduled for July 6 – 22

White-knuckle winter driving may be a distant memory for Minnesotans in July, but the dangers of speeding should be top-of-mind during the 100 deadliest days of summer. A statewide extra speed enforcement and awareness campaign from July 6 – 22 will remind Minnesotans to slow down and drive safely.

The Minnesota Department of Public Safety Office of Traffic Safety (DPS-OTS) coordinates the campaign with more than 300 law enforcement agencies (police, sheriff and state patrol) stepping up enforcement efforts through overtime funding provided by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA).

Drive Fast. Pay Up. Cost of a speeding violation will vary by county, but it will typically cost a driver more than \$110 with court fees for traveling 10 mph over the limit. Fines double for those traveling 20 mph over the limit, and fines for speeding in a work zone are more than \$300. A driver can lose their license for six months for going 100 mph or more.



Unlocked vehicles are easy targets for thieves

Thieves continue to find easy pickings in several of our neighborhoods this summer. Common theme in the reports are unlocked cars with valuables left inside parked on the street or driveway.

Even if you are parked in front of your house, in your driveway or inside your garage, lock your doors. Criminals like to walk down the street and see if a car is unlocked, if it is they open the door and take whatever is visible and move on to the next target. However, if the door is locked, they are more likely to move on.


Hot Dog with a Deputy 2018



School Safety – something to think about every day!

School bus safety for motorists

- In Minnesota, motorists must stop at least 20 feet from a school bus that is displaying red flashing lights or a stop arm when approaching from the rear and from the opposite direction on undivided roads.



- Motorists should slow down, pay attention and anticipate school children and buses, especially in neighborhoods and school zones.
- The best way to be aware of your surroundings (always) is to put the distractions away.
- School bus safety requires participation from students as well as drivers. Parents, it is important to educate your children about proper school bus safety.

Tips for children

- When getting off a bus, look to be sure no cars are passing on the shoulder.
- Wait for the bus driver to signal that it's safe to cross.
- When crossing the street to get on the bus or to go home, make eye contact with motorists before proceeding.

The School Safety Patrol (crossings and buses) will be assisting fellow students throughout the year on the journey to and from school. Look for those bright orange traffic flags when driving in the morning and evening hours. The 900+ School Patrol students in suburban Ramsey County are recognized by the Sheriff's Foundation with a roller skating party in December and a big event in May at Aldrich Arena.

Add bullying prevention to your back-to-school checklist.

While you're getting the kids prepped to go back to lockers and classrooms and gym, don't forget to talk to them about bullying. Chances are that at some point in their life, your child will bully, be bullied, or be a bystander to bullying – and possibly all three. Which is why it's important to talk about it early and often. It doesn't have to be a formal sit-down discussion. Sometimes you learn the most about your kid in passing: casual conversations in the car or while getting ready for school in the morning.

Kids often don't want adults to know they're being bullied, for several reasons. They may not think an adult will believe them or do anything about it. They may worry that the person who bullied them will find out about their report and make the bullying worse. But research shows that bullying has serious emotional consequences, not only for the target of bullying, but for the bystanders who witness it. It can lead to low self-esteem, health problems, poor grades, even suicidal thoughts.

Keep the lines of communication open, and if your child tells you they're being bullied, here are few things you can do:

- Believe your child, stay calm and tell them they were right to report to you.
- Do NOT confront the child who bullied or their parents. Talk to school authorities instead. If necessary, follow up.
- Ask your child what they need to feel safe. This can be things like getting walked to the bus stop for a few days or making sure they have a buddy to eat lunch with.
- Keep checking in with your child about the incident. Has anything new happened? Do they feel safe?

As with anything, practice makes perfect, so you can even role-play what to do when your child witnesses bullying or is bullied: "Pretend I'm Mrs. Thompson. What will you say to me about seeing James take away Shasta's ball on the playground?" The more times your child has articulated their thoughts about bullying, the more comfortable they will be talking about it when the real thing happens. 

A record percentage of front seat occupants in Minnesota are buckling up — 93 percent — yet about 40 percent of all motorists killed in crashes aren't belted — translating into an average of 105 deaths and more than 200 serious injuries each year.

You will never hear a person saying, "I'm glad I didn't wear my seat belt" when they are involved in a crash, but you will find story after story from survivors who credit their seat belts for surviving a crash.

Take the three seconds to fasten your belt – you win by avoiding a costly ticket and could save your life.

Child Passenger Restraint Law - All children under age 8 must ride in a federally approved car seat or booster seat, unless the child is 4'9" or taller.



For the safety of your children:

- Be an attentive driver.
- Always buckle up.
- Always secure your children in the proper restraint for their age, height and weight.
- Always have your children sit in the back seat.






RCSO Sergeant Kirkland, who created and developed the Academy, said one of her goals was to challenge our participants to, "dig deep and to be uncomfortable."





The takeaway from all of this?


For emergencies, issues that need immediate police response, or to report crimes or suspicious activity, don’t post, DO call.

Take Charge of Your Personal Safety!

A mass gathering occurs when a large number of people come together in a particular location for a specific purpose. These locations, especially those associated with large crowds, could be an attractive target for terrorism and other crimes. If everyone plays their part, we can keep our neighborhoods, communities, and the nation safe against the threats we face.

Be Prepared



Take notice of your surroundings and identify potential emergency exit routes.



Be aware of unusual behaviors, unattended objects, unexplained odors, or vehicles traveling at abnormal speeds or patterns.



Establish locations to meet if separated from your group.



Report any suspicious items or activities to law enforcement and/or onsite security personnel.

Don't Hesitate – Take Action



If an attack occurs, run to the nearest exit, making use of available concealment while moving away from the source of hazard.



If no secure areas are available, protect yourself from harm by seeking cover behind any available natural or artificial objects that eliminate direct line of sight from the source of hazard.



Cover your nose and mouth if you notice unusual odors or eye irritation.



If you are unable to safely evacuate, hide in a secure area where access can be blocked or entryways can be locked.



If necessary, be prepared to defend yourself by attempting to incapacitate the assailant with any means available.

Assist and React



Call 9-1-1 and remain alert for potential secondary attacks.



Maintain situational awareness while providing assistance to others.



Render first aid when safe to do so.



When help arrives, follow instructions given by law enforcement and first responders.

Vehicle Ramming

Security Awareness for Soft Targets and Crowded Places

The use of a vehicle as a weapon in a terrorist attack is not new. Recent terrorist incidents and violent extremist propaganda demonstrate that the use of vehicles as a weapon continues to be of interest by those wishing to cause harm. Attacks of this nature require minimal capability, but can have a devastating impact in crowded places with low levels of visible security.

Potential Indicators

The use of vehicles as weapons often has few or no observable indicators but identifying and reporting suspicious activities may assist in detecting a potential vehicle-ramming attack plot. Any one of these activities may be insignificant on its own, but when observed in combination with other suspicious behaviors — particularly advocacy of violence — they may constitute a basis for reporting.

- Reported theft of large or heavy-duty vehicles.
- Observed difficulty in explaining the planned use of a rented vehicle.
- Exhibited nervousness during vehicle rental discussion and insistence on paying rental fees in cash.
- Inability to produce required documentation, such as a valid driver's license or appropriate endorsement for the class of vehicle sought.
- Observed difficulties in operating a rented vehicle, such as large or heavy-duty trucks, indicating a lack of familiarity from prior usage or experience.
- Loitering, parking, or standing in the same area over multiple days with no reasonable explanation.
- Unexplained use of binoculars, cameras, and recording devices.

What Should People Do in Case of a Vehicle Ramming Attack?

- Run to the nearest safe area while moving away from the source of hazard.
- If a fall occurs, curl into a protected position and try to get up as soon as possible to avoid being trampled.
- If no rapid escape is possible, seek cover behind any available natural or artificial objects that eliminate direct line of sight from the source of hazard.
- Call 9-1-1 and remain alert for potential secondary attacks.
- Render first aid when safe to do so.
- Maintain situational awareness while providing assistance to others.
- When help arrives, follow instructions given by law enforcement and first responders.

FACTS & EVENTS

- In October 2017, an ISIS-inspired individual used a commercial-grade rental truck to attack pedestrians on a busy bicycle path near lower Manhattan, New York City, killing 8 and injuring more than 11 others. A pellet gun and a paintball gun were recovered from the scene.
- In April 2017, a stolen 30-ton commercial truck was used to target pedestrians in a busy shopping area in Stockholm, Sweden, killing four people and injuring 15. Undetonated explosives were found in the truck.
- In March 2017, a rental car was used to target pedestrians walking on Westminster Bridge in London, England, killing four people and injuring 40. The assailant abandoned his vehicle and proceeded to Parliament, where he killed a police officer with a knife.
- In July 2016, an ISIS-inspired individual used a 19-ton rental truck to attack pedestrians watching a fireworks display in Nice, France, killing 86 people and wounding more than 430.
- In November 2016, a personal vehicle was used to strike pedestrians on a sidewalk at Ohio State University, injuring 11 people.

Mitigation Strategies and Protective Measures

In designing and applying measures to mitigate against the risk of vehicle ramming attacks, it is important to balance the security requirements with the operational and functional needs associated with the typical user of the facility or venue. As a result, a mitigation strategy cannot be a one-size-fits-all approach, and instead must be tailored to the specific physical constraints and functional demands of a given location.



Physical Security

- Post signage relating to emergency entry and exit points, first-aid stations, and shelter locations.
- Define the perimeter and areas that require access control for pedestrians and vehicles.
- Restrict all vehicular traffic through controlled and secure “pedestrian-only” areas, including separate ingress and egress routes for delivery vehicles away from events.
- Use remote parking and shuttle services to keep vehicles away from critical assets or mass gatherings.
- Establish clear standoff zones. Bollards, heavy planters, and barricades can be used to increase standoff distances between large crowds and vehicles. It is important to ensure that these architectural solutions are appropriately sized, adequately anchored, and purposely reinforced against impact loads.
- Evaluate the need for vehicle barriers, considering passive barriers (fixed bollards, fences, jersey barriers, etc.) and/or active barriers (retractable bollards, rising wedges, etc.).
- If appropriate, pre-position heavy vehicles to serve as physical barriers around the perimeter of densely populated locations.



Access, Planning, and Personnel

- Review personnel files of recently terminated employees to determine whether they pose a security risk.
- Evaluate vehicle traffic patterns near the venue and implement strategies to reduce vehicle speeds and improve pedestrian safety.
- Conduct a site assessment prior to holding an event that identifies vulnerabilities. For example, the driver of the vehicle may not necessarily follow traffic rules (e.g., one-way street), which must be taken into account when developing a strategy.
- Devise credential systems that indicate areas of access and purpose of activity on the premises.
- Monitor all vehicles approaching an entrance or gathering of people for signs of threatening or suspicious behavior (e.g., unexpected truck traffic, unusual high speed, vehicles riding particularly low).
- Design a monitoring, surveillance, and inspection program that is consistent with venue operations and associated security requirements. If surveillance cameras are used, train personnel to interpret video footage and identify potential security-related events.

Mass Gatherings

Security Awareness for Soft Targets and Crowded Places

A mass gathering occurs when a large number of people come together in a particular location for a specific purpose. These locations, especially those associated with large crowds, could be an attractive target for terrorism and other crimes. By connecting with local authorities, developing plans to identify issues and support incident response, training staff and volunteers, and reporting concerns to emergency authorities, many incidents may be mitigated or avoided.

In local communities, DHS Protective Security Advisors (PSAs) work with federal, state, and local government officials and private sector partners to protect soft targets and crowded places. In doing so, PSAs encourage businesses to "Connect, Plan, Train, and Report". Applying these four steps in advance of an incident or attack can help better prepare businesses and their employees to proactively think about the role they play in the safety and security of their businesses and communities.

1 Connect

- ▶ Develop relationships with local law enforcement, fire response, and other businesses in the area.
- ▶ Clarify emergency response responsibilities and other responsibilities related to venue security and emergency response.
- ▶ Share information regarding the event and supporting venue layout with local law enforcement, fire response, and emergency management.

2 Plan

- ▶ Develop plans for security, emergency response, emergency communications, and business continuity.
- ▶ Develop a bomb threat management plan to enable informed decisions and appropriate actions upon receipt of a bomb threat or discovery of suspicious items.
- ▶ Establish procedures for evacuating the venue in the event that a threat is deemed too serious to continue the event.
- ▶ Implement a communication process to inform event attendees of actions to take in case of an emergency and develop scripts for public address announcements.

3 Train

- ▶ Train staff and volunteers on:
 - Security basics, emergency response, emergency communications, and business continuity plans.
 - Staying aware of any suspicious behavior, activities, or items.
 - The "Run, Hide, Fight" response to an active shooter incident and the "Recognize, Avoid, Isolate, and Notify" process when confronting suspicious items or packages.
- ▶ Provide specialized training for employees who will take additional response actions (e.g., using fire extinguishers, administering first aid).
- ▶ Conduct exercises to ensure plans remain applicable, and involve first responders in the exercises to familiarize them with the venue and its security plans, policies, and procedures.



4 Report

- ▶ Post details on reporting suspicious activity, and encourage staff, volunteers, vendors, and the general public to report suspicious behavior to property management security or local law enforcement.
- ▶ Promote general awareness to identify:
 - Potential surveillance; excessive study of event entrances, exits, security features (e.g., cameras or barriers), or personnel; and unexplained use of binoculars, cameras, and recording devices near an event location.
 - Repeat visitors or outsiders who have no apparent business in restricted areas.
 - Erratic vehicle operation, repeated driving near an event location, and parking in the same area over multiple days with no reasonable explanation.
 - Abandoned parcels, suitcases, backpacks, and packages.
 - Bulky or unseasonable clothing.
 - Other unusual behavior, activities, or items.
- ▶ Establish a system for reporting security concerns.

Protective Measures

Mass gatherings — either in the form of indoor events or outdoor gatherings — can take place in many different formats and configurations. The following protective measures provide some basic actions to be considered by those responsible for the safety and security of these locations.



Physical Security

- ▶ Post signage relating to emergency entry and exit points, first-aid stations, and shelter locations.
- ▶ Post signage identifying items that patrons are prohibited from carrying into the venue.
- ▶ Define the perimeter and areas that require access control for pedestrians and vehicles, and identify especially sensitive or critical areas (e.g., control rooms, communications centers, computer server rooms, fuel or chemical storage tanks, mechanical equipment) that require special access controls.
- ▶ Evaluate vehicle traffic patterns near the venue and implement strategies to reduce vehicle speeds and improve pedestrian safety.
- ▶ To the extent possible, keep vehicles at a safe distance from areas where large numbers of people congregate and consider whether fixed or temporary vehicle barriers are needed.
- ▶ Monitor all vehicles approaching an entrance or gathering of people for signs of threatening or suspicious behavior (e.g., unusually high speed, vehicles riding particularly low, vehicles emitting a chemical odor, occupants keeping the windows open even in cold or inclement weather).



Access, Planning, and Personnel

- ▶ Conduct background checks on all staff assigned to critical or sensitive areas.
- ▶ Review personnel files of recently terminated employees to determine whether they pose a security risk.
- ▶ Devise credential systems that indicate areas of access and purpose of activity on the premises.
- ▶ Design a monitoring, surveillance, and inspection program that is consistent with venue operations and associated security requirements. If surveillance cameras are used, train personnel to interpret video and identify potential security-related events.

Chemical Attacks

Security Awareness for Soft Targets and Crowded Places

A chemical attack may be executed by individuals or groups — terrorists, terrorist affiliates, or state-sponsored, and/or organized crime — through the deliberate release of a toxic substances, such as a gas, liquid, or solid, in an attempt to cause public harm, injury, or loss of life. A wide variety of common household and professional grade toxic chemicals can be made, stolen, or acquired for use in an attack, including nerve agents, blister agents, blood agents, choking agents, and irritants.

Potential Exposure Scenarios

Possible delivery methods for toxic substances that could expose people in enclosed or crowded spaces and compromise public health and safety may include:

- Ventilation systems (HVAC) of a building.
- Misting, aerosolizing devices, or sprayers.
- Passive release, such as an open container.
- Improvised explosive devices that combine readily available chemicals.
- Sabotage of facilities or vehicles containing chemicals.
- Introduction of toxins in the food and water supply.

Indicators of a Chemical Attack

Potential signs of chemical exposure may include symptoms such as eye and skin irritation, twitching, choking, difficulty breathing, dizziness, muscle weakness, and loss of consciousness. In addition, the presence of unusual liquid, sprays or vapors, droplets of oily film on surfaces, unexplained odors, unusual dead or dying animals in the area, and/or low-lying clouds or fog unrelated to weather may also indicate the release of a chemical agent.

Acutely toxic chemicals can cause serious injury or death if inhaled or absorbed through the skin. The table on the following page outlines ways to detect several highly toxic chemicals and/or chemical weapons.

FACTS & EVENTS

- In 2018 and 2017, the Syrian government released a toxic substance, possibly a nerve agent, on its citizens.
- In mid-2017, the Australian government disrupted a plot allegedly hatched by ISIS supporters who intended to build and set off a device to release toxic gas in a public enclosed space.
- In 1995, thousands were injured and 12 people killed in Tokyo, Japan when members of the Aum Shinrikyo cult released sarin gas during morning rush hour in one of the world's most crowded subway systems.
- In March 1988, after some Kurdish guerrillas joined an Iranian offensive, Iraqi aircraft bombed the Kurdish town of Halabja, Iraq near the Iranian border with choking and nerve agents, killing nearly 5,000 people, mostly civilians.

What Should People Do in Case of a Chemical Attack?

Indoors

- Do whatever it takes to find clean air quickly; protect respiratory functions by covering nose and mouth.
- Open or break a window to access clean air.
- Quickly exit the facility without passing through contaminated areas.
- Evacuate to street or roof, if safe to do so.
- Seek medical attention.
- Call 9-1-1, follow directions from emergency personnel when they arrive on scene.

Outdoors

- Avoid any obvious plume or vapor cloud; protect respiratory functions by covering nose and mouth.
- Walk away from site and into a building to shelter-in-place.
- Enter an indoor facility, immediately lock doors, close windows, and air vents to block external airflow as quickly as possible.
- Go to a room with few windows and seal the room to create a temporary barrier between people and contaminated air outside.
- If necessary, seek higher ground to avoid chemical contact that often remains at surface level.
- Call 9-1-1, follow directions from emergency personnel when they arrive on scene.

Protective Measures to Reduce Impacts of a Chemical Attack



Physical Security

- Review procedures for evacuation and shelter-in-place.
- Post signage relating to emergency entry and exit points, first-aid stations, shelter locations, and prohibited items from being carried into the venue.
- Define the perimeter and areas that require access control for pedestrians and vehicles, and identify especially sensitive or critical areas that require special access controls (e.g., control rooms, communications centers, computer server rooms, fuel or chemical storage tanks, mechanical equipment).
- Evaluate vehicle traffic patterns near the venue and implement strategies to reduce vehicle speeds and improve pedestrian safety.
- To the extent possible, keep vehicles distant from areas where large numbers of people congregate and evaluate the need for fixed or temporary vehicle barriers.
- Monitor work being done adjacent to the facility or venue (e.g., road construction, utility equipment servicing) for signs of unusual activities (e.g., planting packages near assets or gathering places).
- Work with the local emergency medical services for recommendations on how to handle medical emergencies, considering first aid stations, triage, and transport sites, as well as emergency routes in and out of the facility.



Access, Planning, and Personnel

- Design a monitoring, surveillance, and inspection program that is consistent with venue operations and associated security requirements. If surveillance cameras are used, train personnel to interpret video and identify potential security-related events.
- Inspect packages, briefcases, backpacks, parcels, and luggage being carried by people, where practical (e.g., employees, contractors, vendors, visitors, and patrons). Post signage identifying prohibited items.
- Accept deliveries and shipments only from known shippers, vendors, or customers.
- Train receiving personnel to recognize suspicious mail, packages, or deliveries, and instruct them on notification procedures.
- Conduct background checks on all staff assigned to critical or sensitive areas.
- Review personnel files of recently terminated employees to determine whether they pose a security risk.
- Devise credential systems that indicate areas of access and purpose of activity on the premises.

Active Shooter Attacks

Security Awareness for Soft Targets and Crowded Places

An active shooter is an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area. In most cases, active shooters use firearm(s) and have no pattern or method to their selection of victims, which creates an unpredictable and quickly evolving situation that can result in loss of life and injury. Other active shooter attack methods may also include bladed weapons, vehicles, and improvised explosive devices. While law enforcement is usually required to end an active shooter situation, individuals can take steps to prepare mentally and physically for the possibility of this type of event occurring in order to save lives.

Be Alert to Signs of Trouble

While active shooter situations are often unpredictable, paying careful attention to warning signs could go a long way in mitigating a potential incident. Some shooters demonstrate progressively escalating risk factors in their mindsets and behaviors that characterize them as violent prior to an attack. Recognizing these warning signs and reaching out for help could bring at-risk individuals to the attention of law enforcement sooner and prevent a future attack.

Potential warning signs include:

- Increasingly erratic, unsafe, or aggressive behaviors.
- Hostile behavior based on claims of injustice or perceived wrongdoing.
- Drug and alcohol abuse.
- Claims of marginalization or distancing from friends and colleagues.
- Changes in performance at work.
- Sudden and dramatic changes in home life or in personality.
- Financial difficulties.
- Pending civil or criminal litigation.
- Observable grievances and making statements of retribution.

You can help ensure the safety of those around you.

- Be aware of drastic changes in attitude toward others.
- Take note of any escalations in behavior and report to supervisor.
- Provide any information that may help facilitate intervention and mitigate potential risks.

FACTS & EVENTS

- In March 2018, three people were killed by an armed gunman during a hostage situation at Yountville Veterans Home in Napa County, California.
- In February 2018, 17 people including students and teachers were killed and 17 more were wounded when a gunman opened fire inside Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida.
- In October 2017, 58 people were killed and 851 were injured when a gunman opened fire from the window of a hotel room on a crowd of concert goers at the Route 91 Harvest Music Festival on the Las Vegas Strip in Nevada.
- In June 2016, 49 people were killed and 58 were injured when a gunman opened fire inside Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida.
- In December 2012, 20 children between six and seven years old as well as six adult staff members were killed when an armed gunman opened fire in Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Connecticut.
- In July 2012, an armed gunman opened fire at a Century movie theater in Aurora, Colorado, killing 12 people and injuring 70 others.

What Should People Do In Case Of An Active Shooter Attack?



"Run" to the nearest exits, making use of available concealment while moving away from the source of hazard.



If unable to safely evacuate, **"hide"** in a secure area where access can be blocked or entryways can be locked, and, as appropriate, **"fight"**.



If no rapid escape is possible, seek cover behind any available natural or artificial objects that eliminate direct line of sight from the source of hazard.



Call 9-1-1 and remain alert for potential secondary attacks.



Render first aid when safe to do so.



Maintain situational awareness while providing assistance to others.



When help arrives, follow instructions given by law enforcement and first responders.

Protective Measures



Physical Security

- Post signage relating to emergency entry and exit points, first-aid stations, and shelter locations.
- Define the perimeter and areas that require access control, and identify especially sensitive or critical areas that require special access controls.
 - Establish surveillance plan to complement perimeter controls.



Access, Planning, and Personnel

- Conduct periodic background checks on all staff assigned to critical or sensitive areas.
- Review personnel files of recently terminated employees to determine whether they pose a security risk and ensure they are removed from systems.
- Devise credential systems that indicate areas of access and purpose of activity on the premises.
 - Issue special identification badges to contractors, cleaning crews, vendors, and temporary employees.
 - Require that badges be displayed at all times and verified to gain access to the building.
 - Collect all badges when visits are complete.

FLAVORED TOBACCO PRODUCTS



WHAT TYPES OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS ARE FLAVORED?

Flavored tobacco products include cigars, chewing tobacco, blunt wraps, electronic cigarettes and shisha, the tobacco used in hookah. These products help the tobacco industry avoid the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) 2009 prohibition of flavored cigarettes.¹ Flavored tobacco products are often sold in attractive packaging for a low price. Cigars are frequently available for less than \$1.

MANY COMMON FLAVORS ARE USED IN TOBACCO PRODUCTS.

Cigars, chewing tobacco, blunt wraps, electronic cigarettes and shisha are sold in fruit, candy, dessert and novelty flavors. Popular flavors include chocolate, piña colada, apple, grape, berry, cotton candy, bubble gum and menthol. The same flavorings used in tobacco products are also used in candy and Kool-Aid.² These flavorings are often present in higher amounts in tobacco products than in candy.²

These pineapple-flavored cigars are cheap and easily accessible to youth.

WHO USES FLAVORED TOBACCO PRODUCTS?

Flavoring in these products makes it easier for new, young users to take up tobacco, because the flavoring masks the harshness of the tobacco and enhances the user's experience.³ Nearly 90 percent of addicted adult smokers started smoking by age 18.⁴

Because of their sweet flavors, low cost and attractive packaging, flavored tobacco products are especially appealing to youth. Young people are much more likely to use flavored tobacco products than adults.³ The 2014 National Youth Tobacco Survey (NYTS) found that among current tobacco users, 73 percent of high school students and 56 percent of middle school students had used a flavored tobacco product in the past month.⁵

According to a report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), 63 percent of the students who use electronic cigarettes use flavored e-cigarette juice. Also, 64 percent of those who use cigars use flavored cigars, and 61 percent of those who use hookah use flavored shisha.⁵

Studies show that young people perceive flavored tobacco products as tasting better and being safer than unflavored products, even though they are just as dangerous and addictive as cigarettes.⁶

WHAT DOES THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY HAVE TO SAY ABOUT FLAVORED TOBACCO PRODUCTS?

Documents from the tobacco settlements revealed the "Graduation Theory," a method used by the tobacco industry that aimed to secure customer loyalty.⁸ This approach implies that new users start with milder tasting and flavored products. Then, they graduate to full-bodied, less flavored items that often contain more nicotine, resulting in a life-long addiction.



Smokeless and spit tobacco are available in flavors such as apple and cherry.

The tobacco industry's own internal documents state sweet products are "...for younger people, beginner cigarette smokers, teenagers...when you feel like a smoke, you want to be reminded of bubble gum."⁷

WHAT CAN COMMUNITIES DO ABOUT FLAVORED PRODUCTS?

Flavored tobacco products are a major public health concern because they encourage young people to start using tobacco. While the FDA banned flavored cigarettes other than menthol in 2009, the ban does not affect other tobacco products, many of which are now heavily marketed by the tobacco industry. The use of these products, especially among young people, has spiked.⁵

State and local governments can adopt laws that restrict the sale of flavored tobacco products within their jurisdiction. Limiting the sale of products, setting a minimum price or creating a minimum pack size for cigars are some of the ways communities can protect their youth. According to the 2000 U.S. Surgeon General's Report, raising prices of tobacco products decreases tobacco use among youth and young adults.⁹ Making flavored tobacco products less accessible has the potential to reduce youth tobacco use.

WHAT COMMUNITIES HAVE TAKEN A STANCE AGAINST FLAVORED PRODUCTS?

Locally, Minneapolis and Saint Paul restricted the sale of flavored tobacco, allowing flavored tobacco to only be sold in adult-only tobacco shops, meaning convenience stores can no longer sell flavored tobacco products. This significantly reduces availability and visibility of the products.

New York City and Providence, R.I., passed policies restricting flavored tobacco sales, with the exception of menthol-flavored products. Chicago passed an ordinance restricting sale of all flavored products, including menth cigarettes, within 500 feet of schools except in adult-only tobacco retailers.


INCREASING THE TOBACCO SALE AGE TO 21



WHY RAISE THE TOBACCO SALE AGE?

The tobacco industry heavily targets young adults ages 18-21 in order to recruit new tobacco users and guarantee profits. Approximately 95 percent of current adult smokers started before they were 21.¹ In Minnesota, no one under 18 years old is allowed to buy tobacco. Youth get tobacco from several sources, including social sources. A 16-year-old has more contact with and access to 18-year-olds who can buy tobacco. However, it is less likely a 16-year-old would ask a 21-year-old for tobacco. Increasing the age gap between young people and those who can legally buy tobacco will reduce youth access to tobacco.

A 2015 report from the Institute of Medicine (IOM) found that increasing the legal age to purchase tobacco to 21 would decrease smoking initiation among 15-17-year-olds by 25 percent.² A Minnesota-specific study looked at the impact of raising the tobacco age and found that 25 percent fewer 15-year-olds would start smoking by the time they turn 18 and 15 percent fewer 18-year-olds would start smoking by the time they turn 18. This translates into 30,000 young people not becoming smokers over the next 15 years.³ If youth don't smoke by the time they are 21, they likely never will.




Nicotine is harmful to the development of the adolescent brain.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT OF NICOTINE ON ADOLESCENT BRAIN DEVELOPMENT?

Nicotine is addictive and is particularly harmful to the developing adolescent brain. Evidence suggests that nicotine interferes with brain maturation and can have a long-term effect on cognitive development and mental health.⁴ Even brief or intermittent nicotine exposure during adolescence can cause lasting damage.⁵

The addictive properties of nicotine can lead adolescents to heavier daily tobacco use and a more difficult time quitting later in life.⁶ Nicotine exposure can also increase the risk of addiction to other harmful substances.⁵ The long-term effects of nicotine on the adolescent brain is a significant public health concern.^{7,8}



3 out of 4 adults favor increasing the sale age for tobacco to 21.

WHO SUPPORTS RAISING THE TOBACCO SALE AGE TO 21?

A 2014 national survey shows that 75 percent of adults favor increasing the minimum sale age for tobacco to 21. A national consensus is growing to protect young people from a lifetime of addiction and health problems caused by tobacco by raising the tobacco sale age. In addition, 70 percent of current smokers and 65 percent of those age 18-24 support raising the minimum tobacco sale age.⁹

IS YOUTH TOBACCO USE STILL A PROBLEM?


The percent of students who smoke cigarettes is declining, but the 2016 Minnesota Student Survey found that 9th and 11th graders in Minnesota are now using e-cigarettes at twice the rate of regular cigarettes.¹⁰ Increasing the sale age to 21 would reduce youth access to all harmful tobacco products, including e-cigarettes, cigars and hookah.

WHAT CAN STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS DO?

California, Hawaii, New Jersey, Maine, and Oregon, along with a growing list of more than 300 cities in the United States, have raised the tobacco sales age to 21. Edina, Saint Louis Park, Bloomington, Plymouth, North Mankato, Falcon Heights, Shoreview, Minneapolis, Saint Peter, Richfield and Roseville have raised the age in Minnesota. The city of Needham, Mass., raised the legal tobacco sales age to 21 in 2005. Within five years, tobacco use among high school students decreased by nearly half.¹¹
